BURLINGTON BURLINGTON OF PARTMENT Utility Energy Efficiency Utility


- Municipally owned since 1905
- Serves Burlington proper
- Reports to the Mayor and a 5-person volunteer commission appointed by City Council
- ~ 20,000 customers:

Residential - 16,500

Commercial - 3,600 (70% of sales)

- 25% college students
- Overseen by the Vermont Public Service Board

#### **The History of Efficiency**



- Late 70's started some programs
- 1990 pivotal year
  - Defeat of a generation contract in 1989
  - Passage of an Energy Efficiency Bond in 1990
     (\$11.3 million)

- 2000 State Legislature creates the EEU
  - Reporting requirements increased significantly

#### **EE Codes and Ordinances Help**

- EE Code for New Construction and Retrofits first in 1987, updated in 1991.
- Burlington's Time-of-Sale Ordinance
  - mid-'90's
- Our codes became basis for state-wide RBES and CBES.

# How do we get their interest?



- Sit at table with Planning Dept. when projects are reviewed
- Provide lots of guidance during implementation
  - Prescriptive rebates, customized rebates.
  - Inspection of work take place.
- Visited by a BED Energy Specialist
- Bring full package to projects
  - Including help with financing

#### **The Programs**



- Services available for home owners, renters and investment property owners.
  - Lots of residential work comes from high bill complaints.
  - Free Home energy audits available.
- Services available for small, medium and large commercial accounts.
- Cash positive!

#### **Two New Programs**



- OBF (On Bill Financing)
  - Started with a \$1 million grant from EDA to create revolving loan fund.
  - Loans structured so that estimated monthly savings are greater than monthly loan payment.
     No out-of-pocket costs for customer.
- PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy)
  - Legislature passed enabling legislation.
  - Burlington voters approved creating the 'district'.
  - The loan is transferred with the property.

#### **Demand Response**

- Run a Demand Response Program
- Shaved over 2 MW on New England Peak Day.
- Includes 17 of BED's largest customers.
- We're exploring DR for smaller customers.

#### **Program Results**

- \$19.3 million has been invested by BED.
- Customers have invested another \$22.6 million
- Overall usage as a whole was down 5.3 percent in 2012 from 1989.
- Efficiency investments have saved Burlington customers \$15.4 million in 2012 alone.






#### **The Impact of Our EE Programs**

### Community Benefits of EE Programs: Pro-environment, Pro-economy

- Efficiency investments helped Burlington avoid the release of 20,310 tons of CO2 in 2012. (equivalent to removing 3,620 cars from roads)
- Participating customers have reduced their retail electric costs by \$8.9 million annually
- Efficiency project dollars are kept in the community and recycled, strengthening the local economy
